**MEADS SPD ADOPTED.** At a special Full Council meeting on the 8<sup>th</sup> August the Council adopted the final version of the Meads Supplementary Planning Document This meeting was preceded by a public meeting at which members of the public were able to have their say. #### **CONSULTATIONS AUGUST-SEPTEMBER:**

- Eastover SPD. A new Supplementary Planning
  Document is being produced to guide development in
  the Eastover area of Bridgwater. The Council's Executive
  has approved the Issues and Options document for
  consultation and a first stage public consultation begins
  21<sup>st</sup> August. See opposite.
- Community Infrastructure Levy. A preliminary draft charging schedule for the Community Infrastructure Levy has been approved by Exec for consultation which runs from 14<sup>th</sup> August to 25<sup>th</sup> September. See overleaf and www.sedgemoor.gov.uk/cil

# HINKLEY POINT C. The examination into a Development Consent Order for a new nuclear power station at Hinkley is scheduled to close on 22<sup>nd</sup> September. Five more hearings are planned at which registered Interested Parties may speak; 4 issues specific hearings at Bridgwater & Albion RFC in August, and an open floor hearing at the Exchange on 6<sup>th</sup> September. #### Eastover SPD

Building has now started on the new Bridgwater Community Hospital with completion planned in 2014. This means the current building, a key site in Eastover, will become available for redevelopment. This Supplementary Planning Document is therefore now being given priority in order to ensure that policy guidelines are in place before proposals come forward, and that redevelopment of the site acts as a catalyst for the enhancement of the wider Eastover area as set out in the Bridgwater Vision. The SPD is intended to cover the 'Eastover triangle' with reference to the wider area.

### Community Infrastructure Levy

#### Preliminary Draft Charging Schedule

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) (as set out in the Planning Act 2008) is a new system of developer contributions which is intended to supplement other public sector revenue streams to ensure that new community infrastructure can be provided to keep pace with population growth.

A Preliminary Draft Charging Schedule has now been prepared with basic rates as below, and comments are invited on this between 14<sup>th</sup> August and 25<sup>th</sup> September 2012. #### Census 2011

The first Census data release affirmed the ONS Estimates upon which Sedgemoor's Core Strategy is based. The resident population of Sedgemoor is given as 114,600, indicating a rise of 8.2% since the 2001 Census; this is significantly higher than neighbouring local authorities. The number of households in the District has also seen a significant increase of 9.8% from 2001, with 48,800 households recorded in the 2011 Census. The age distribution of the population has remained unchanged, with the disparity towards the upper age brackets continuing; 72.4% of the population is over 40 compared with the national figure of 49.1%.
