HOT NEWS

CORE STRATEGY SUBMITTED. The Sedgemoor Core Strategy was submitted to the Secretary of State on 3rd March, and Inspector Brian Sims BSc CEng MICE MRTPI has been appointed to conduct the examination. See opposite for the expected timetable.

PROGRAMME OFFICER APPOINTED. During the examination period, the Programme Officer acts as a channel of communication between the Inspector, the Council and those making representations on the Core Strategy. He or she assists the Inspector with administration, arranges meetings and hearing sessions, and is the first port-of-call on questions relating to procedural aspects of the examination. Core Strategy Examination What happens next?

The Inspector has been sent all the relevant information about the Core Strategy, including the evidence base and a copy of all representations made on the Pre-Submission document. He will now decide how the examination is to be run, begin to assess what the main issues are that he will wish to examine in detail at the hearing sessions, and to decide who is to be invited to speak at which session. All those who made representations and who expressed a wish to be heard at the hearings will be given a chance to speak, although those wishing to speak on matters that the Inspector considers not to be part of the main issues may be encouraged to submit written representations instead.

The Inspector may ask for further written material from representors, and/or a written response to particular questions of clarification, but there will be no opportunity to voluntarily submit further written material prior to the hearing sessions.

If the Inspector decides it is needed, a Pre-Hearing Meeting will be arranged at which he will clarify procedural matters and finalise the hearing programme. It will be important for all those wishing to attend the hearing sessions to be present at this meeting. The Programme Officer will be in touch with representors about this meeting in due course, but it is expected to take place in mid to late April.

Hearing sessions are expected to begin in June, and our current best estimate is that they will last no longer than three weeks. They will take place at the Princess, Burnham-on-Sea.
